A TRUE AND PERFECT INVENTORY of all the goods, chattels and credits of Peter Van Orden late of the Town of Windham, in the county of Greene, deceased, made by John Betts, Frederick Martin and Mary Van Orden Administrators of the said deceased, with the aid and in the presence of Wyllys Loomis and Edward Johnson, they having been previously appointed Appraisers and qualified as such. Done at Windham in the County of Greene, this 5th day of October 1841.
