Dear Mr. Frost:

I have been interested in the Frost family for several years, and abstract all records I find regardless of whether they are our Frosts or not. One can never tell when something might tie in to make it fit.

I am enclosing my notes on your Frosts, and hope that they will help you in completing your family data. I have never gone into the early Guilford records except for marriage bonds etc., but have read a few Stokes records looking for mine.

Do you know where your James Frost came to N.C. from? Ours came from Morristown, N.J. You will find (from my notes) that Eliz. Frost, daughter of James B. was married in Mo. A look at the 1850 census records might be helpful in finding other members of the family. It is not reasonable to think that she went west alone. She might have gone with her uncle John H. Winston, who was her guardian at the death of her father.

Do you have Bible records or other documentation on the names and dates you sent in your letter to me? You seemed to know where the children of James and Isabelle Frost married. My Frost ancestor went to Mo. and then to Oregon, so I am interested in all Frosts who are now in the mid west and west. Perhaps Vera Ashbury told you about some of them.

My husband and I spent several months in Lincoln, Nebraska, and I was anxious to look into records there, but my husband was ill and I did not have an opportunity.

On this 20th day of May 1847 personally appeared in open court Rachel Britt, resident of the County of Johnston, aged 60 years, who having been duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision of the act of Congress passed the 4th July 1816--That she is the daughter and only living child of Capt. James Frost who was an officer of the Revolutionary War and of Isabella Frost, deceased--that her father the said Capt. James Frost and her mother the said Isabella Frost removed from the State of Pennsylvania and in the year 1775, as she has heard them declare, and settled in the County of Stokes or Guilford--her father was an ironworker and came from the iron district of Pennsylvania and to the same region in North Carolina for the purpose of working in iron--Some years after the Revolutionary War broke out her father formed a company and marched to the South, as she believes to South Carolina and Georgia, and was in a battle the name of which she cannot now remember distinctly as it is only from the hearing of her father and mother that she has any knowledge of these matters; in this service her father was about either six (or) nine months the length of time, she cannot state precisely, for the recollection-- About one year after this period, her father was called into service again in an expedition against the Tories in the southern part of this state and was absent from home as she has frequently heard from her mother, three months. She has heard her father say he was at Ramage Mills in what year she cannot pretend to say; in this, as well as all the service he was engaged in, he commanded a company, the first of which was raised in the County of Guilford and afterwards from Stokes or Rockingham--from which counties he marched the men he commanded--at the Battle

of Guilford he was in command of a company and she has often times heard him narrate the counts of the action and of troops and their following the British Army several days after the battle--her father served, in the several times he was in, one year and a half from what she has heard him repeatedly declare and the statement she now makes is only from the recollections of their conversations of her father and mother in relation to his record and what was commonly believed by all who knew him. She further declares that her father intermarried with her mother in the year 1769 in the State of Pennsylvania, what county she cannot now say, but recollects having heard her father and mother frequently say they had two children born when they came to No. Carolina. --next that Ezekiel was born in 1770 or 1771 and that Jonas was born about two years before they immigrated to this State; there were a number of other children, but these two were the oldest and herself the youngest of the family. She has no record of the time of the marriage and the register of the ages of the children, if any was kept, must have been taken by the brothers above mentioned when they moved up to Stokes or Guilford where they both died a few years since. That her father with all his family moved to this county in the year 1795 for the purpose of working an iron mine then discovered and supposed and still believed to be rich--valuable, and died in the year 1815 about 73 years old. That she remained with her mother and all the family here where she has still lived, and that her mother remained a widow up to the time of her death the 1st Oct 1837, making no application herself for the pension due on account of the service of her husband Capt. Jas. Frost because she was not aware she was entitled to anything; and this declarant herself has been very recently apprized that she could receive the amount due to her mother the said Isabella Frost deceased who was about 86 years old when she died--She therefore makes this application with the humble hope the pension due her mother the said Isabella Frost may be allowed her.

James Frost came to this county with his wife the late Isabella Frost and a large family of children from the upper County Guilford or Stokes for the purpose of opening and working a rich iron mine then discovered here and still considered a rich vein of ore--that he lived here and died in the year 1815--that he had two sons Ezekiel and Jonas Frost, the oldest children and that he always understood from Capt. Frost and Mrs. Frost both these children were born before they immigrated from Pennsylvania and that there was but little difference between his deponent's age and Jonas Frost the second child of Capt. Frost--this deponent further states he intermarried with the daughter of Capt. James Frost and therefore had every opportunity of knowing their ages, history, etc. from this intimacy--that his wife died in the year 1830 and that Isabella Frost died on the 1st October 1837 supposed to be in the 86 or 87th year of her age. This deponent further states he has hundreds of times conversed with Capt. James Frost about his services in the Revolutionary War and heard him speak of being in several battles, particularly at Ramage Mills and at Guilford Court House--That in all the service he performed he was a captain--that particularly above time an election for Captain was held by the candidates placing themselves in open space and the men were directed to march up to the man of their choice, and that every man of the company marched up to Capt. Frost--This deponent further states he ^{as} is/well convinced that Capt. Frost performed the service he spoke of as though he had witnessed them himself because he was old enough to remember the latter part of the War and the events narrated by him coincided with his own recollection of these events, and besides, Capt. Frost was a man

of great intelligence and respectability of character and had no motive in giving false statements of his services. He was also a man of scientific knowledge which was required in the business he carried on exploring and opening iron mines--He further states that from the ages of the two oldest children Ezekiel and Jonas Frost, Capt. Frost and his wife must have intermarried long before the War of the Revolution, he knowing it from the fact that they frequently compared ages with himself and there was not much difference between his own and the age of the second one, Jonas Frost. He states further that as he was acquainted with Capt. Frost and Mrs. Frost, believed fully in the history and statements of them here set forth by him.
