**Description:**

This database of North Carolina marriages to 1825 contains over 103,000 names. Each entry includes groom, bride, marriage date, county, and state. Every name is indexed so you can search for one name, or two names that are linked.

The marriage date is usually the date of marriage as given in the original entry. However, when no marriage date is given (e.g., the "marriage return" was not provided to the record keeper), the date of the license is used. In a few cases, a marriage will be listed twice, but in two different counties. This most often happened when a couple obtained a license in one county, but were actually married in another.

These marriage records, compiled by Liahona Research at the LDS Family History Library in Salt Lake City, UT, unfortunately do not contain citations for the origin of each entry. The purpose of this database is to provide a time and place for as many marriages as possible. It is up to the researcher to examine original records (see the Family History Library Catalog--available at any LDS family history center-- under the heading "Vital Records" for the appropriate locality) and gather whatever additional genealogical information is desired.

How Can I Best Research in the North Carolina Census, 1790-1890?

Censuses can provide useful details and information about your ancestors and can be used to fill in gaps of information missing from other records. Information gathered from state censuses can also be used as a springboard to lead you to other records. Remember that an index entry is only a reference to more detailed information found in census records themselves. It is important that researchers consult the actual census records to which these indexes refer.

All available census schedules, from 1790 to 1930, have been microfilmed and are available here at Ancestry.com, at the National Archives in Washington, D.C., at the National Archives' regional archives in twelve states, at the LDS Family History Library and LDS family history centers throughout North America, at many large libraries, and through microfilm lending companies. Some state and local agencies may have census schedules only for the state or area served.

How Can I Best Research North Carolina Marriage Bonds, 1741-1868?

There are many types of marriage records. Some of these include consent affidavits, marriage banns (this was a religious custom), marriage bonds, marriage licenses, and marriage certificates. The information provided on these records will vary according to purpose and the year in which they were created, but almost all of them will at least list the names of the bride and groom and the date and place of the event. Occasionally the names of the couple's parents, ages of bride and groom, birthplaces of bride and groom, signature of the issuing clerk, and other details will also be found among marriage records.

Use information found in marriage records to lead you to other records. For instance, if the ages of the bride and groom are listed in the record, you can calculate an approximate date of birth, which will then tell you when to begin looking for birth records of these individuals. Try to match the dates on marriage licenses to newspaper announcements of weddings that can fill in extra details. Also, see if there are city directories, church records, or other records of the individual that you have been able to pinpoint being in a certain place at a certain time.

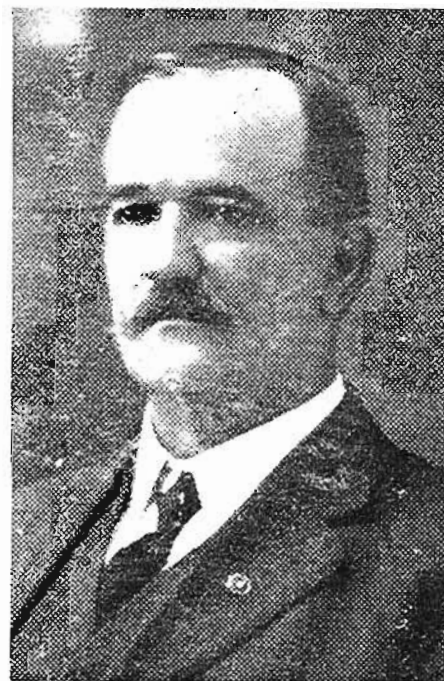
All of these moved from Stokes County. Edwin died Jan. 18, 1940.

Gaston and Emily Carroll were the parents of seven children: Minnie married Numa F. Carroll, Hattie married John Tavis, Dora married Perry Turner, Ernest married Delia Walker, Demie married 1st John Will Barber, 2nd Eddie Ledford, Myrtle married Victor Davis, and Etta married L.W. Roberts.

The only descendent of his marriage in Stokes County today is Carolyn Turner Jones, wife of Dr. J.R. Jones of King.

Emily Tillotson died Jan. 27 1902. His second marriage was to Ella Gentry, daughter of Ivy. B. and Eliza Gordon Gentry, April 6, 1906. Their children were:

Robert F. Carroll former Stokes County Tax Supervisor-Collector, member of the Board of Education and an amateur genealogist and local historian who is contributing much to this book "*The Heritage of Stokes County*". He married Ruth Bennett. (He is a widely read and popular columnist for *The Danbury Reporter* — Editors.)

Ruth G. a registered nurse living in Charlotte, N.C., married H.H. Ahrens.

Robah G. "Jack" farmer and World War II veteran. He married Mary Jane Hall. Their farm is part of the land that his great grandfather, Ira E. Gentry bought in 1858.

HARDY CARROLL

385

Hardy Carroll was born in Sampson County March 12, 1791, son of Alexander and Lucy Royal Carroll. His parents were married April 7, 1783. His maternal grandfather was Hardy Royal, for whom he was named.

The will of Alexander Carroll lists the following children: Rebekah, Phanny Bridges, Hardy, Wylie, Reason, Mary Ann Ledder and Betty Ann Royal.

Hardy joined the army at an early age and served in the War of 1812, rising to the rank of Major. After the war he came to Stokes County and on March 18, 1815 married Elizabeth Ferguson, daughter of John and Hannah Ferguson. She was born Feb. 18 1794.

It is safe to assume that one reason for Hardy Carroll to come to Stokes County was that he and Nicholas Frost, also a veteran of the War of 1812, became good friends during their army days. Frost and John Ferguson

were neighbors in the Neatman Creek community of North Meadows Township.

When Carroll married Elizabeth Ferguson, Nicholas Frost was his bondsman. This official at weddings in those assumed a great responsibility, especially if the groom was from another area. There had to be more than a casual friendship between two men when one of them would take this risk for the other.

He bought his first land in 1825 and eventually became the owner of over 1500 acres.

Hardy and Elizabeth were the parents of four children; Mary Ann, their only daughter who married Landon H. Southern, Calvin J. who married Valerie Johnson, John H. who married Selena Jane Johnson and Hardy R. "Rile" who married Minnie Judd Gibson.

In 1839, the first year of free public schools in North Carolina, he was elected by his neighbors as one of the local committeemen for District #43 and served in this capacity until 1846.

In March 1851 he qualified as a Justice-of-the-Peace and took his seat on the bench. At this same session he was appointed a member of the Stokes County Board of Common School Superintendents (This was the forerunner of the Board of Education). He held this position until 1858. This session was the next to last term every to meet at Germanton Courthouse. The September Session met at the new Courthouse in Crawford, later Danbury. During the years that he was a J.P. he served many times as a member of the Court of Pleas and Quarters and several times as Chairman of said Court.

He was a Trustee of the Missionary Baptist Church of Christ at Friendship Meeting House and was on the Board that bought one acre of land on which to build a new meeting house Jan. 23 1849.

He died March 28, 1858 and his wife died August 20, 1872. They are buried at the Carroll Graveyard just off the Mountain View Church Road.

HARDY ROYAL "RILE" CARROLL

Hardy Royal Carroll was born in Stokes County Feb. 14, 1839, the youngest son of Major Hardy and Elizabeth Ferguson Carroll. Officially he was "Hardy R.", he always signed his name "H.R." but all his friends and acquaintances called him "Rile". He was named after his great grandfather "Hardy Royal" of Sampson county.

He married Minnie Judd Gibson on April 9, 1859. She was his first cousin, the daughter of Martin and Mary Ferguson Gibson.

He was included in a list of students attending District #43 in 1847, where his brother-in-law Landon H. Southern was teacher.

A list of teachers in Stokes County for 1860 included H.R. Carroll.

He was in the Civil War where he rose to the rank of Captain. He evidently volunteered from some other county as his name is not included in the veterans from Stokes County.

He was a local school Committeeman for District #50 from 1877 through 1887. Appointed post master at Neatman August 17, 1880 when it was first established and served until Sept. 12, 1890.

He was appointed a Justice of the Peace Feb. 10, 1866.

The Conservative Party meeting in Danbury April 30, 1870, selected him as a candidate for county commissioner. He was forced to withdraw as he was under a "ban of Proscription". Although a Justice of the Peace, he had not been pardoned for taking up arms against the United States.

H.R. and Judd Gibson Carroll the parents of six children:

- (1) Dewitt V. Carroll. (2) Gaston A. Carroll. (3) Sidney L. Carroll, teacher, merchant, postmaster and Justice of the Peace born April 4, 1863. He married Ellen Tillotson. They did not have any children. He died Nov. 8, 1901. (4) Edwin Wallace Carroll. (5) Ellen J. Carroll born Feb. 15, 1866, died in 1887, never married. (6) William Totten Carroll married 1st Connie Hege, 2nd Vesta Davis. Moved from the county at an early age.

JOHN H. CARROLL

John H. Carroll, son of Hardy and Elizabeth Ferguson Carroll, was born August 21, 1833. He was included in a list of students attending school District #43 in the Hawpond area.

He married Selena Jane Johnson, March 4, 1852. she was the daughter of William and Temperance Kiser Johnson. She was born November 22, 1832 and was the sister of Valeria, wife of Calvin J. Carroll. They were the parents of four children: William Hardy, Henry Wade and China Rosetta and John Tipton.

He enlisted in the Confederate Army July 25, 1862, at Danbury, age 30, was promoted to Corporal November, 1864. He was captured at Saylor's Creek in Virginia on April 6, 1865 and released June 27, 1865. He was in the Co. G, 21st Regiment.

In 1888 he was appointed County Coroner. He served several terms as local school committeeman in Meadows Township.

After the War he was appointed a government inspector for stills, traveling over the county to inspect and approve measuring devices and the proof of the whiskey, and to closely observe the distillery in operation to see that all Federal regulations were carried out. When he put his stamp of approval on a still, it and the product turned out were legal.

His children all by his first wife and grandchildren follows: William Hardy, born May 11, 1853, married Nancy Adeline Southern on December 29, 1870. Their children are: Susan who married Lee Kiser; Willie, who married Etta Allen; Joseph F., who married 1st. Rennie Baker, and 2nd Dora Tillotson; Abram who married, 1st. Mary Ellen Tillotson, and 2nd, Betty Holland; Lillie who married first William Thore, and second John Thornburg; J. Moses who married Carrie Southern; Silas who married Florence Meadows; L. Jonah who married Della L. Smith; and Raleigh married Lydia

Tew, a daughter of Abram M. Carroll. Margie Carroll Dunlap, widow of former Sheriff Wesley Dunlap, who was elected Stokes County Commissioner in 1978, and was the first woman to ever hold this position in Stokes County was decendent of this line.

Henry Wade Carroll was born in 1856. He married Nancy Louise Morgan Jan. 8, 1874. After her death he married Mary Baxter Lloyd. Their children (all by his first wife) are Fannie, who married Silas Hartgrove; Cicero, who married first Ollie Holland and second Mertie Hall; and Coy, who married Grace Moser.

China Rosetta Carroll was born October 13, 1861 and married Francis J. Baker April 24, 1879. Baker, a deputy sheriff, was killed in a raid June 2, 1881. After his death she married Johnny M. Redding on December 6, 1891. All children by Baker are Wiley O., who married first Minnie Holland, and second Martha Kiser; James H., who married first Lula Mae Tillotson, and second Bertha C. Tillotson. One son by her second marriage was Roy S. Redding who married Minnie Hartgrove.

John Tipton Carroll was born January 23, 1867. He married Rosebud Bowers Nov. 14, 1889. Their children were Eddie, who died in infancy, Rosa E., who married R.B. Hutcherson,; L. Owen who married Lillian Saintaing; Winfred, who married first Fleta Goolsby and second Minnie Ann Shelton; Sadie, who married Harvey Spainhour; Alvin, who married Addie Doss; Mary Alice, who died in infancy; Gertrude, who married Taylor Tuttle; Waldo, who married Vera Elsie Jester; Mildred, who married Elmo Cromer; and Newell, who married Margaret Merritt.

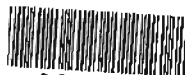

1. **James Frost** (Rev. War Pension Application R 3815), NC Line, filed by daughter **Rachel (Frost) Britt** 26 May 1847 in Johnston Co., NC, stated her parents moved from PA to Stokes or Guilford Co., NC, in 1775. Her mother was **Isabella Vandyke**, whom the soldier had married in PA in 1769. They had sons **Ezekiel Frost** and **Jonas Frost** when they moved to NC, and she was the youngest child. **Ezekiel Frost** was b. in 1770 or 1771, **Jonas Frost** about 1773. **Ezekiel Frost** married **Elizabeth Buchanon**, the Rockingham Co., NC, marriage bond dated 10 Feb. 1798 with **Joseph Lemond** bondsman. He died prior to 8 March 1841 in Stokes County. There are loose estates papers at the NC State Archives. How Can I Best Research North Carolina Marriage Bonds, 1741-1868?

There are many types of marriage records. Some of these include consent affidavits, marriage banns (religious custom), marriage bonds, marriage licenses, and marriage certificates. The information provided in these records will vary according to purpose and the year in which they were created, but almost all of them list the names of the bride and groom and the date and place of the event. Occasionally the names of the bride's parents, ages of bride and groom, birthplaces of bride and groom, signature of the issuing clerk, and other details will also be found among marriage records.

Use information found in marriage records to lead you to other records. For instance, if the ages of the bride and groom are listed in the record, you can calculate an approximate date of birth, which will then tell you where to begin looking for birth records of these individuals. Try to match the dates on marriage licenses to newspaper announcements of weddings that can fill in extra details. Also, see if there are city directories, church records, or other records of the individual that you have been able to pinpoint being in a certain place at a certain time.
