5.0 AERT/ARTHUR VAN DYKE

Aert/Arthur Van Dyke, son of Aert/Aurt Van Dyke and his wife, was our ancestor. He was born in 1724 in New Jersey?; Bermuda?. On 18 October 1755 he married at Freehold City, Monmouth County, New Jersey, as her third husband, CATHERINE SCHENCK. (NEW JERSEY COLONIAL DOCUMENTS, Vol. XXII, p. 413). She was the daughter of Roelof Janse Schenck and Geesie Hendrickson of New Jersey. Prior to her marriage to Arthur Van Dyke, she married (1) Simon De Hart; she married (2) Peter Couwenhoven. She had 2 De Hart children and 4 Couwenhoven children. Catherine was baptized on 21 December 1718 in Monmouth County, New Jersey. On 20 February 1808, Arthur Van Dyke made a Will; proved 27 September 1809 which places his death date between those two dates. In this Will he does not mention his wife, only his children, so perhaps he was then a widower?

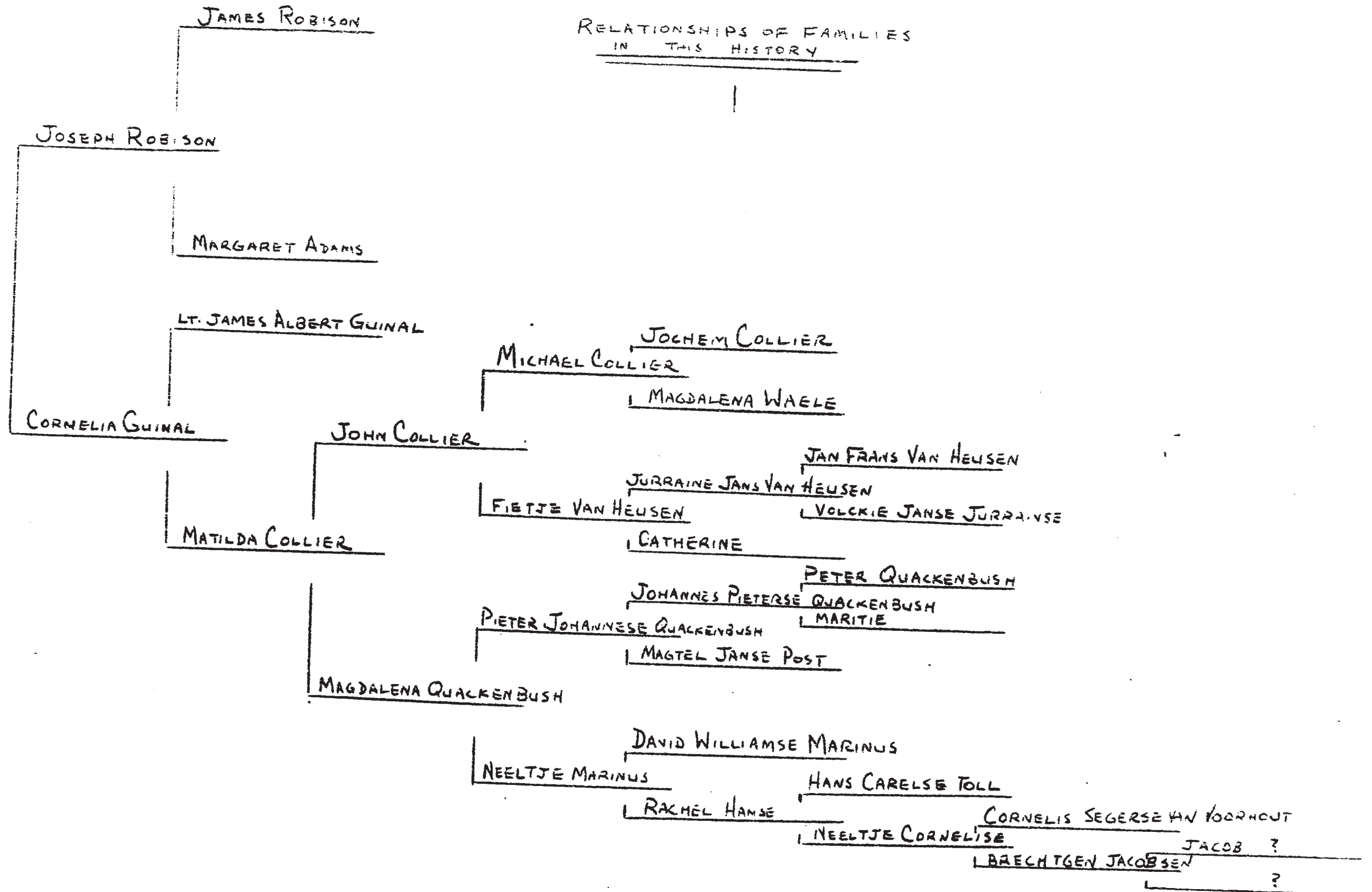

THE ROBISON FAMILY

"Always the path of American destiny has been into the Unknown. With each new test, and each new time and cost, there were those prepared to pay the cost. In settling the frontier of America, there was the great Unknown of a vast continent of wilderness to be faced. Through the trials and hardships of the Revolutionary War there was the Unknown again. Later in the trials of crossing the plains and pioneering the West, there was the Unknown."

Our ancestors were willing to face and help conquer the Unknown and pay the Cost. I regret very much not being able to trace the Robison line back any farther than we have it, but I have tried to help conquer the Unknown. We had a Researcher in New York help for some time but she was unable to find anything. In a letter to me she said: "I can find no trace of the Robisons, why your folks didn't even get in jail." Well, at least, that is something worth knowing! Quite a number of years ago my sister hired a Genealogist from the Genealogical Society to work on the Robison line. She was unable to follow it in New York where it was supposed to be so she said the family was wrong, that Joseph Robison who married Cornelia Guinal was born in Dorchester, Mass. a son of James Robinson and Sarah Breck and changed his birth date to the birth date of Joseph, the son of James Robinson and Sarah Drack.

The Robinson-Breck line is very easy to follow and it was no trouble to give us a pedigree to the American immigrant. But I never did think that it was right. I did not, however, have a chance to investigate it until the summer of 1946, when I was doing research for the Partridge Family and as usual was thinking of my Mother's Family--the Robisons. I first investigated the St. George Temple Records and found that Matilda Robison King and her son, Volney, had done work in that Temple in 1882 and she had done work for her grandmother, Margaret Adams, wife of James Robison but there was no mention of Sarah Breck.

Later I found some Family records in possession of my cousin, Albert Robison in Provo, and he kindly let me take them. I found there the record taken from the record of Matilda R. King, of James Robison and Margaret Adams, parents of Joseph Robison who married Cornelia Guinal. I wrote to the President of the Robison (Breck) Family Organization and he sent me the record of Joseph Robinson son of James Robinson and Sarah Breck. This record showed that he married Susannah ? and had four children all born in Milton, Massachusetts (close to Dorchester) the oldest son being Joseph Cox Robinson. He sent the family group. I was convinced then that we had been on the wrong line. I sent to Montgomery County, N. Y. and received some records from the Dutch Reformed Church in that

vicinity and found that there was no conflict with those records and the records Aunt Matilda had. There are still many names I cannot yet place.

In 1869 Matilda Robison King and her Husband, Thomas Riev King took what they called a "Visiting Mission," to Pennsylvania, Michigan, and New York. I copied the following from a letter written by Thomas R. King to his son William in Hawaii: Bethel, November 12, 1869:

"We arrived here at James Bennie's (Susan's husband) in Michigan on the tenth and found the folks well and pleased to see us but do not want to hear anything about Mormonism. Your mother was wonderfully disappointed in the looks of your Aunt Susan, can't believe that she is her sister, has altered so much and then her ideas are so foreign to the principles of truth. Sends her love to Aunt Margaret, would like so much to see her."

Another letter dated December 19, 1869 from Volney King in Fillmore to his brother, William, in Hawaii:

"Received a letter from Father and Mother last evening. They were at Uncle James Robison's in Pennsylvania, found him to be an old looking man and in not very good health nor spirits, having lost his wife three weeks previous and was living with his daughter. They seemed to have quite an interest in Father and Mother and quite willing to listen. Aunt Susan Bennie was with them and Joseph (Joseph V.); Martha stayed in Michigan. Father and Joseph meeting with quite success in their labors, the people were quite willing to hear and allowed them the Universalist Church to speak in."

The following is from a letter Thomas R. King wrote from Onandaga, N. Y. to William in Hawaii dated December 20, 1869:

Joseph and I held two public meetings near your Uncle James in Pennsylvania, had a very good congregation."

I am sure that Great Aunt Matilda gathered what genealogical information she could while she was there. I am very grateful to her for the Genealogical work she started and the record she left for us to build on. I have made this explanation to show why we discarded the Robinson-Breck line. This line has been adopted by a great many members of the family and I think there are still some who are reluctant to discard it. Well, so much for the "Fall of the House of Breck" as my brother calls it.

Many have asked what was the original spelling of the name Robison and when the change was made. It would be impossible to say. In the Dutch Reformed Church Records we find Robbison, Robberson, Robison, Robinson. The marriage of Joseph and Cornelia is recorded as Joseph Robertson and Cornelia Quineald. My mother's oldest brother writing to his Uncle from Crata, Illionis signed his name Robinson (as he did all his life) and his father writing on the same sheet of paper signed his name Robison. The first Robison we have any record of on our line is James Robison, who according to Aunt Matilda's record was from Charlestown, Montgomery Co. N. Y. Born about 1740. He married Mararet Adams who died in May, 1821.

At that time what is now Montgomery Co., was part of Albany Co., Tryon County was formed in 1772, then right after the Revolutionary War the name was changed to Montgomery. The town of Charlestown is now Glen.

As I write I have in my possession information which may, with further research, add several more generations to the Robison Pedigree. This was not obtained through the New York researcher. This information, if proven authentic, will be available to the Family Members who are interested. The Children of James Robison and Margaret Adams as given in Matilda King's record and found recorded in the Dutch Reformed Church records:

JOSEPH ROBISON a son of James Robison and Margaret Adams, was born 26 June 1768 in Charlestown, Montgomery, N. Y. according to his daughter, Matilda's record. His marriage to Cornelia Guinal (Quenald, Quenell etc.) is recorded 1 January 1794 in Dutch Reformed Church Records as having taken place at Fort Plain, Montgomery Co. N. Y.

Cornelia was the daughter of (Lt.) James Albert Guinal and Matilda Collier. She was born 11 February 1778 six months after her father was killed at the battle of Oriskany. She died 26 April 1829 in South Auburn, Schuykill, Pennsylvania. Joseph died 9 June 1839, Oswego Co. N. Y. We have a family tradition that Cornelia was the homeliest girl in the Dutch Colony, but there was no girl there with a sharper, keener wit than hers. As near as I can make out they lived in "York State" until about 1815 when they moved to Tunkhannock, Luzerne Co, Penn. where their twins were born 27 April 1817. This place of birth is given in Peter Robison's Patriarchal Blessing. CHILDREN of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal:

Cornelia died in Pennsylvania in April 1829. Her son Joseph had married Lucretia Hancock in February 1829 in Clay Onandaga, N. Y. and after her death the father, Joseph Senior, and the younger children moved to N. Y. According to Grandmother Lucretia's account the children lived with her and Grandfather until they left home to work or were married. The father died 1839 in Oswego Co. where Joseph was living at the time. My grandmother said, "Big strapping fellows they were, Mr. Robison's brothers." She always called her husband Mr. Robison. Joseph Robison was a cooper by trade.

JOHN ROBISON was the oldest child of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal born 17 November 1796 in Charlestown, Montgomery Co., N. Y. He married first 19 June 1825 Caroline Hollenbeck who died leaving him with one daughter. He married second Olive M. Howard daughter of Samuel B. Howard and Nancy Jones. John remained in Pennsylvania where all of his children were born in Meshoppin, Wyoming Co. He died in South Auburn, Schuylkill Co., Pennsylvania 20 September 1848. At the time of his death, his brother James Miller Robison wrote to my grandfather Joseph, who was at that time in Crete, Illinois. This letter is very interesting which I will give here:

Dear Brother Joseph:

"Under deep affliction I write the following intelligence. Once more it has pleased Almighty God to call from amongst us a near and dear Brother, yes one that has been near to us in the family in which we were raised. Our dear Brother John is no more. A week ago last Wednesday morning he got up as usual (as he has not been entirely confined to his bed for some time) and said Olive I feel almost alarmed about myself; why said she Because I feel almost well this morning. I am almost afraid I shall indulge a hope that I may live sometime yet. Sometime in the afternoon he began to grow worse. In the evening went to bed earlier than usual and grew worse and worse the night got up at 4 o'clock and said he felt strange sat up about an hour and went to bed again his cough was not as bad as usual. Olive discovered a change in his countenance, went to Caroline wished her to get up and go in and see her father as she thought he was failing fast, dressed herself and went in and asked how he did, he calmly answered and said he thought he had but a few hours to stay "the Lord has called and I must go." The neighbors were called in, he remained perfectly calm and sensible through the day at 4 P.M. he called his family around him and talked to them some time very composedly and finely told them to prepare to meet him in heaven as composedly as if he was going to take a journey. Mr. Torrey asked him if he felt resigned "Yes-yes, all is well I am prepared to go" and dropped away perfectly easy without a struggle or groan. Thus our dear Brother left us with the endearing hope and consolation that our loss is his eternal gain. For my part I feel it a great consolation that he died here amongst us in his own native land.

The children feel the loss of their dear Father especially Caroline and Charles and poor Olive feels almost unconsoleable, it seems as though she cannot give him up. Mr. Torrey preached the funeral sermon to a large congregation. When I left theer Olive requested me to write to you imediately. I wrote to you four weeks ago and when I was agoing to the post office I saw George Wilson and he said he was going to start to Chicago next day and would mail it their whether you got that or not I don't know. We are all well as common yet, no rain yet of any consequence I had forgotten to tell you how Caroline came to be at Johns she was teaching a select school at \$2,50 pr week in Albington Centre she left the first of last Aug. and came home as she heard her father was worse with intension of staying with him while he remained and did so and is yet. She is a bright and highley accomplished female of bright tallents and a good education.

John requested Mr. Torrey to preach his funeral sermon which he did from Rev. XIX-6,7, and 8 verses on Sunday at the Methodist Meeting House.

Dear Brother it seems as though I cannot close till I write a little more but it is needless for me to attempt to communicate my feelings to you, but I yet indulge a hope that I may yet see you on the shores of time but it is not probable unless you come here for my health is such that it is not likely that I shall se Ill. (see Illinois) My complaint is such that I do not know how soon I may drop away perhaps suddenly. Do Joseph come and see us soon Rest yourself a little from the cares of the world and come the journey. is not very long and the expenses not great.

I think if I was as able to take a journey as you are it would not be long before I would see you. It would rejoice me to hear that you ware in your former state and standing in the Church or at least that you had renounced somewhat of your late principles. But no more of that now do write soon I don't care if it is tomorrow direct to So. Auburn, Pa. I want you Joseph to write to Olive immediately Poor woman she needs consolation in her affliction let her know that you have not forgotten her and write as consoleable letter as possible

I shall now close Polly as usual sends her love

As I copied this I thought perhaps James Miller Robison did feel very much alone-- he was the only one left of the big family of Joseph and Cornelia Robison. So many of the family had embraced the unpopular Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and I think from what he says to grandfather and from other letters he wrote later he was opposed to the new religion.

The following is from a letter written by Volney E. King to his brother, Culbert 3 December 1907:

"You know it is just as natural for the Robisons to like their kindred as it is for them to eat and their hearts correspond with their large statures and it is their unbounded love for their kindred and great respect for there fellow man and it is natural too for them to take upon themselves the troubles of others. I believe these natural traits of character will always be found in the Robison blood."

Lovina was dead, his brother William Henry died less than two years before in a wild land (Iowa) far from home. Delilah died in January of that year in Iowa while on her way to Utah. Peter was on his way to Utah. Grandfather Joseph was in Crete, Illinois making preparations to go west. Matilda and Margaret were members of the Mormon Church and on their way to Utah with their husbands. Susan was married and living in Michigan and very much opposed to the new Religion. In spite of James Miller's poor health he outlived grandfather eight years.

JAMES MILLER ROBISON was the second son and third child of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal. He was born 24 November 1800, Charlestown, Montgomery, N. Y. and died 9 April 1875. He married Mary Howard who died 1858 and he married second Mary---. According to Census returns of Oct. 1860. His second wife was Mary age 36 she died November 1869. After her death James Miller moved to Binghampton, Broome, N. Y. where his son, Howard live. The Census gives his occupation Lock Tender. He was probably named for his mother's step-father, James Miller whom Matilda married after the death of James Albert Cuinal. It seems that James Miller Robison was very religious man although he was very much opposed to Mormonism. I will copy from a letter he wrote to his son Culbert, who was in Fillmore, Utah in 1875:

"This evening while sitting here alone I thought I would write a little more, but what can I say for myself. When I think of all the mercies the Lord has bestowed on me I am astonished and amazed. What reason I have to love and obey Him for all these kind and undeserved favours. Well I do love the Lord for He has done great things for me. When I think of the precious promises revealed to me in His holy word, it is happiness to my soul. The hope that I have salvation is worth more to me than all the joys of this world. How often I think of my dear children. Could I but hear that they had saut and found the salvation of Jesus precious to their souls, how it would happify my soul. Then I would begin to think that my prayers had been answered."

There is much more in the same strain. James Miller Robison Belonged to the Mason Lodge and was buried by the Lodge Members, in Hawlyton Township close to Binghampton, Broome, N. Y. where his tombstone is still standing.

This information was obtained partly from the Census returns of Wyoming Co. Penn. of Oct. 1860 and partly from family Records; it may not be completely accurate but we have been unable to check it at the present time.

WILLIAM HENRY ROBISON was the third son and fourth child of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Quenell, born 6 July 1802 Charlestown, Montgomery, N. Y. He married 23 January 1823 Elizabeth Squires born 24 December 1802. Her parents are unknown and the place of her birth is uncertain. I have been unable to get anything on the early life of Gt. Uncle William but I think he must have gone to New York with his brother Peter and his sisters after the death of their mother. There is no date given of his baptism into the Mormon Church but in February 1846 he was in Nauvoo where he had his endowments in the Temple, shortly before the Saints left there. He probably left there with the rest of the Saints and went to Winter Quarters. I have heard from some of his family that he was working extra hard and working over time to finish a house before winter but he died of Cholera 27 November 1846, they also tell before he died he called his oldest son James Henry to him and urged him to make every effort to help his mother and the family to follow the Saints West.

Henry, as he was called, was sixteen years old and there were five children younger. Another baby girl was born the next May. The family came to Utah about 1851. I have read the account of his death in the Journal History of the Church in the Church Historian's Library and the name is given as Robeson. One of the Library attendants gave me permission to write the name correctly above that with a pencil.

The mother, "Aunt Betsey" as she was called was according to all I can learn about her was a very wonderful woman with great faith.

JOSEPH ROBISON was the fifth child and fourth son of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal, born at Charlestown (now Glen), Montgomery, N. Y. 21 May 1804. The last three children of his parents were born in Pennsylvania and in the Proctor Genealogy he is spoken of as Joseph Robison of Pennsylvania. In New York he met and married (his daughter says at Clay, Onondaga, Co.) on the 5 February 1829 Lucretia Hancock, daughter of Benjamin Hancock and Lucretia Proctor, born August 27, 1807 in Shrewsbury, Rutland, Vermont. Their first home was at Clay where their first five children were born. They then cleared timber land in Schroepfe Township, Oswego Co. N. Y. While here they became acquainted with Mormonism and embraced it whole-heartedly. They were baptized 4 February 1841 after the ice had been cut in the Oswego River for that purpose. From then on preparations were made for the family to join the Saints in Nauvoo, Ill., and in the summer of 1844 they left New York and started for Ill. but before reaching Nauvoo they met Missionaries who told them that the Prophet Joseph Smith and his brother Hyrum had been killed by a ruthless mob and were advised not to go there, accordingly they stopped at a small place called Orete, in Will Co. about thirty miles from Chicago, and is now the suburbs of that city. They remained there for ten years, keeping in mind all the time their preparations to go to Utah. From there Joseph wrote to his brother-in-law in New York, he said: "I should like to see all my old friends and acquaintances but I do not wish to come there to live again." It is interesting to note that he signed his name Robison and his son, Alfred writing on the same paper signed his name Robinson and signed it that way all his life. In Alfred's letter to his uncle Proctor he said: The folks reached Fillmore August 22, 1854 with ten children, one daughter-in-law, 1 grandson, making 14 in number. They had 7 wagons, 16 yoke of oxen, 2 cows, 4 horses, 2 colts." We still have this letter, faded and worn but still plainly readable. They hauled lumber from Chicago to build a house. In the spring of 1854 they sold their farm for \$2,200.00 and the money was quilted in a deep hem in Grandmother's Lucretia's petticoat and carried safely to Utah. The trip was made without the oldest son Alfred, who did not join the church and lived all his life and died in Illinois. The family stopped in Salt Lake City and paid tithing to President Brigham Young, who instructed them to go to Fillmore, Utah which they did. They lived in a fort for a number of years and then built the first

rock house in Fillmore with walls two feet thick in the first story and eighteen inches in the second story. This house is still standing and in good condition. (1958) Joseph Robison and his sons were active in the Community in both Civil and Religious affairs, always ready to lend a helping hand to new-comers. Brother John Ashman, for many years a Patriarch, says when his father's family came to Fillmore they suffered for the necessities of life. Joseph Robison took his home-made wheel barrow--made of barel staves, (for he was a cooper)--loaded it with a ham, a side of cured bacon, sack of flour, potatoes, apples and delivered it after dark. This was^{not} the only trip of this kind that Joseph made, always after dark, and the load was sometimes topped with one of Lucretia's warm serviceable quilts. Many people spoke of Joseph Robison as being the kindest man they ever knew. Louise Yates Robison said to me: "Your grandfather was a fine old gentlemen, but Lucretia was a stern uncomprising Puritan," but both had qualities desirable in any ancestors. My father, his son-in-law, said he never knew a kinder man than Joseph Robison. Joseph Robison was Mayor of Fillmore at the time of his death which occurred 3 June 1868 and his term was finished out by his son, Joseph V. Robison. Grandfather Joseph was caught in a blizzard while on his way to Deseret where he was helping his son, Benjamin, who was Bishop there, to build a dam to supply water for the town. He was lost and was out all night and died as a result of the exposure. "Joseph Robison was a quiet, unassuming man of sterling worth, good judgement and absolutely reliable and dependable. He was a hard worker, a good provider and esteemed his family above all else. He valued his religion very highly, and at his passing he had an abiding faith in his religion and the resurrection of those who espoused its cause." Lucretia Hancock Robison died 27 August 1899 in Fillmore, Utah.

LOVINA ROBISON was the sixth child and the first daughter (to live) of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal. She was born 26 December 1806 Charlestown, (now Glen) Montgomery, N. Y. and died 16 November 1835 and buried 17 Nov. 1835 white Plains Cemetery, Clay, Onondaga, N. Y. She married Orange Warner a son of Horatio Warner and perhaps Julia Burzee, born 23 June 1805 Charlottesville, Schorale Co., N. Y. died 12 June 1881 Fillmore Utah. I do not find the date when Orange Warner joined the Latter-Day Saints but I am quite sure it was after Lovina Died. Dates from the Archives Copy, by Alberta Simmons.

MATILDA ROBISON was the eighth child and the fourth daughter of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal born 1 March 1811, Charlestown (now Glen), Montgomery, N. Y. She was eighteen years old when her mother died in Pennsylvania. After the mother's death the Robison Family, with the exception of the two older boys John and James Miller, returned to New York where the younger children lived with my grandfather Joseph and Lucretia. Little items of interest have been gathered from my cousin, Adelia Robison Robison, who lived with grandmother Lucretia for a number of years and has written and remembers a great many things our grandmother told her. She says grandmother Lucretia thought a great deal of Matilda who went out to work until her marriage to Thomas Rice King 25 Dec. 1831 in Cicero, Onandaga, N. Y. After her marriage she took her youngest sister Margaret to live with her. It is interesting to note that Margaret was baptized January 1843 by Thomas Rice King, her brother-in-law. Thomas Rick King was born 9 March 1813 in Marcellus, Onandaga, N. Y. a son of Thomas King and Ruth Hyde. Matilda and her husband were baptized members of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in July 1840 and must have started immediately for Nauvoo, Ill. as their record shows that their first daughter and fifth child was born at Montrose, Lee, Iowa in July 1841. They went to the Nauvoo Temple on the 12 January 1846. In March 1847 they were in Winter Quarters (which is now Florence Neb.)

when their son Volney was born. Volney's daughter, Mrs. Etta Lythgoe of Cowley, Wyo., writes: "Grandfather Thomas Rice King writes in his history of raising corn three years at Florence, Neb. near Omaha so they could immigrate in comfort. Grandmother said they had three wagons of their own and their boys drove stock belonging to them. They arrived in Salt Lake in Oct. 1851 and in company with other immigrants from the States they went to what was later named Millard Co., where a fort was built as a protection from the Indians. On the 21 November 1851, the County was named Millard and the town, Fillmore, in honor of Millard Fillmore who was President of the United States. The Thomas R. King Family stayed in Millard County from 1851 to 1876--twenty-five years--build homes, married and had families." While crossing the Plains, they were in Vincent Shurtliff's Company. They then moved to what was then called Circle Valley where they lived the "United Order" with other families until 1883, when the "Order" was discontinued. Thomas R. King and his family were active in the Church and aided greatly in helping to build up this new country. As I have told before, Matilda and Thomas R. King went to Pennsylvania, New York and Michigan on a "Visiting Mission" leaving Salt Lake October 1869 and returned to Fillmore 9 March 1870. These two dates are from the Journal of Platte D. Lyman. They were accompanied by my mother's brother, Joseph V. Robison and his wife, Martha. While in Pennsylvania, they visited Matilda's brother James Miller Robison. That must have been a happy meeting of a brother and sister who had not seen each other for nearly 30 years. According to Matilda's granddaughter, Lillie King Hinckley, "Matilda, dearly loved her brother James Miller Robison and was greatly attached to him." Matilda Robison King and her son Volney did work in the St. George Temple in October 1882 and I am very sure that part of the record, at least, that she used there was obtained when she was on this "Visiting Mission." The Robison Family should be forever grateful to Great Aunt Matilda for the work she did there and the Genealogical foundation she laid for us to build on.

Thomas Rice King died February 1878 or 1879 in Kingston, Piute Co. Matilda died 19 February 1894 in Kingston and they both buried at Antimony, Garfield, Utah. The town of Kingston was named after the King Family settled there.

SUSAN ROBISON was the ninth child and fifth daughter of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal, born Charlestown (now Glen), Montgomery, N. Y. 2 October 1813 and died 25 April 1889 in Michigan. I know very little of her life; she was sixteen years old when her mother died in Pennsylvania. She no doubt returned to New York with her father and younger children. Here the older girls worked until their marriage. She married William Beagle, who was born according to one record about 1811 in Bronson, Branch, Michigan and died between 1838 and 1844. For about that time she was married to James Bennie who was born 3 June 1802 and died 1 May 1870. Matilda Robison and her husband went on a "Visiting Mission" in 1869 and on November 12th of that year Thomas Rice King wrote a letter to his son William from Bethel. "We arrived here at James Bennie's in Mich. on the 10th and found the folks well, seemed pleased to see us, but do not want to hear anything about Mormonism." He tells of the change in Susan, such a change that Matilda can hardly believe she is her sister.

A letter dated December 19, 1869 written by Volney King to his brother William says that their parents were in Pennsylvania with James Miller Robison and Aunt Susan Bennie was with them. Susan visited her sisters and brother Peter in Fillmore later.

DELILAH ROBISON was the tenth child and sixth daughter of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal, born 27 April 1817 (twin) in Cornelia Guinal, Born 27 April 1817 (twin) in Tunkhannock, Luzerne, Pennsylvania.

She was twelve years old at the time of her mother's death and went with her father and the younger children to New York. Before 1837 she married Orange Warner (see Lovina), who had previously married her sister Lovina, who had died and left one child, Byron, who was at this time about three years old. I have not been able to find out much about her life. From the dates we have we know that she and her husband went to Nauvoo, for on the 7 February 1846 they received their endowments in the Nauvoo Temple. But they were not allowed to stay there long, their enemies never let them rest long and shortly after February 7 the Saints began to leave Nauvoo. She had one child while they were in Hancock Co., where Nauvoo is and if the story of the rest of her short life could be told it would doubtless be one of suffering and privation, but ever with a wonderful courage that led her on, never relinquishing sight of the goal they were sacrificing so much to reach. She died in Iowa 12 January 1848 leaving six children, the youngest less than a year old. All honor to such a woman, her descendants should rise up and call "her name blessed." The 1850 Census returns of Freemont Co., Iowa gives the name of Orange Warner age 45, Mary age 28 and seven children the youngest Cyrus, age 8 months, Mary's child. The third wife of Orange Warner, Mary Tyler was young to take the responsibility of such a family but she and Orange kept them together and brought them to Utah where they arrived in 1851. Delilah has a numerous posterity:

PERCIVAL ROBISON was the eleventh child and fifth son of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal, born (atwin to Delilah) 27 April 1817 Tunkhannock, Luzerne, Penn. He was twelve years old when his mother died and he went with his father to New York where he lived with my grand parents, Joseph and Lucretia Hancock Robison, for some years perhaps until he was married. He married October 6, 1839 at Gilbert Mills, N. Y. Miss Celina Hayward Chaffee. From an account written by my mother's brother Alvin. "My father cut his way a half mile into the dense forest

and started to clear up a farm which he had bought from a man by the name of Schroepfle. The second year the snow fell four feet on the level. This was in Oswego Co. I started to school when I was four years old (1838). The school house was built on father's land. I remember sitting on the doorstep and mocking the crows flying around. The teacher was Celina Chaffee and afterwards married my Uncle Peter Robison, father's brother."

This furnishes the setting for the young eighteen-year-old school teacher. Celina Chaffee was born 26 December 1820, Sequehanna, Pennsylvania, a daughter of David Chaffee and Lucy Perrin. I have no date of Peter's baptism but his first child was born in 1841 after they left New York. I have always had the impression that he joined before my grandfather (Joseph) did. He and his wife were in Nauvoo in 1846 with his brother, William and his sisters and they too received their endowments in the Nauvoo Temple 7 February 1846. They came to Utah in 1850 and went on to Millard Co. where Peter later settled at what is now Knosh but the small settlement was then called Petersburg or Hatton. During the years 1857 and 1859, he labored in England as a Missionary and from 1859 to 1862 he was Presiding Elder of Petersburg in the Millard Stake. He died in Garrison, Millard, Utah 20 Oct. 1902 and is buried there. Celina died 17 November 1861. CHILDREN of Peter Robison and Celina Hayward Chaffee, the first three before coming to Utah, No. four in Salt Lake City, Utah and the rest in Fillmore, Millard Utah.

MARGARET ROBISON was the twelfth child and seventh daughter of Joseph Robison and Cornelia Guinal b. 13 May 1819 in Luzerne Co., Pennsylvania. She married Alva Phelps born 16 November 1813 in Susquehanna Co. Pennsylvania. He joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and was baptized by Rufus Fisher on January 1843, was ordained a Seventy in Nauvoo, Illinois. His wife, Margaret was baptized in January 1843 by Elder Thomas Rive King, her brother-in-law.

Alva and Margaret received their endowments in the Nauvoo Temple on the 9 January 1846. Alva Phelps joined the Mormon Battalion leaving his wife in very poor circumstances in Winter Quarters. He died in September 1846 while with the Battalion.

I heard his granddaughter, Elida Callister Ellison tell the following at our Family Reunion in Fairmount Park in 1946. Margaret, who had been living in a "dugout," was among those who had received word that some of the Battalion boys were coming home. She obtained a room, moved from the "dugout" and with what limited means she had she began making preparations for his homecoming. She went to church one Sunday and one of the speakers, she thought it was President Young, said "Our hearts go out in sympathy to Sister Phelps this morning because of the death of her husband." That was the first Margaret had heard of it, she started to leave the Church but fainted at the door. Her brother William hurried to help her and later in trying to comfort her said that as long as he had a crust of bread he would divide with her. It was not long, however, until William fell victim to Cholera. Soon after the news of her husband's death Margaret gave birth to a tiny premature daughter, whose chances for life were very slim but she grew to maturity, married Thomas Callister and became the mother of ten children.

My Grandmother Lyman (Eliza Maria Partridge) tells in her journal this. "One woman living near us whose husband was in the Battalion. When it was time for them to return she was very much elated, rented a room and made all preparations for housekeeping. But O, what a disappointment awaited her. When she thought her happiness nearly complete they told her that he was dead. O, the agony that she endured, it cannot be described. My heart ached for her but I could not comfort her." I have always felt while reading this that the woman was Great Aunt Margaret, it could very well have been. I do not know when she came to Utah, but she later married William E. Bridges and had one child who died. Margaret died 8 May 1891.

The information for these family groups has been obtained from various sources. Family records from different family members, which, be the way, did not always agree, Archives copy at the Genealogical Society, Journal History of the Church in the Church Historian's Library. Biography record of the Second Quorum of Seventy pg. 151 in the Church History Library.

GUINAL - QUENELL etc.

The name Guinal has different spellings. Great Uncle Peter always spelled it with a Q but grandfather and Aunt Matilda spelled it Guinal. Knowing as I do, the Dutch records after they were mixed with the English, produce some queer combinations in spellings. Andrew J. Provost and Herbert Seversmith, Genealogists, say they think the name is Quennell from the prominent family of that name in Surrey, England. James Albert Quennell may have been one who went from England to Holland for religious reasons. On our family records he is known as Albert but his war record is James, sometimes Grinnell. The Genealogical Society suggested using both names.

(Lt) James Albert Quinell was born probably about 1744. "He was a 2nd Lt. in the New York Troops and was among the heroes, who under the brave Herkimer fell at Oriskany, the first battle where our flag was stained with patriot blood. He died the 6 August 1777.

Our family tradition is that after he was wounded he made a great effort ^{to} get to his knees and prayed God to bless his unborn child and prosper the American cause. The prayer of this brave Patriot was answered and today he has a numerous posterity, through the daughter who was born six months after his death, many of them in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.

"No perfect Roster of the names of the patriots from Tryon Co., who fought at the battle of Oriskany has been preserved. They came from the various parts of the Co. and the slaughter filled old Tryon with such grief that history was neglected in the general horror. They were patriots of the highest rank and their names should be perpetuated in history and this leads us again to express our regret at the loss of the Roster. From Frothingham's History of Tryon Co. page 85.

From Forts and Firesides of the Mohawk Country, N. Y. by Vrooman page 229 It. James Grinnell is listed as being from Canjoharie, Montgomery Co., N. Y., killed at Oriskany while fighting with Colonel Herkimer. Are we doing our part as well as he did? James Albert Quenell married first in the Dutch Reformed Church in Stone Arabia, Montgomery, N. Catherine Louise Wood, of Kenosha, Wisconsin, wife of Howard Van Wyck was a daughter of Peter Henry Wood, who was a son of Uriah Wood and Sarah Cornue, daughter of Peter Cornue and Jane Lovina Quenell,^{who} was a daughter of (Lt.) James Albert Quenell and Lena Ven den Werken, claims her right to belong to the Daughters of the American Revolution through this lineage.

THE COLLIER FAMILY

JOCHEM COLLIER was born about 1617, his nationality has not been definitely established. He appears first in North Amsterdam shortly before 9 March 1642 when he brought a son to be Christened in the Ref. Church in Manhattan. He is recorded there as Jochem Kayker. He appears often (his name spelled differently) as sponsor for children, of some of his friends or perhaps relatives. He leases land etc.

John O. Evjen, a learned scholar, considers that Jochem Kalder, as he calls him was either Norwegian or Danish. He suggests that Kalder sounded strange to the Dutch who gave the name a different spelling, however, the universal spelling now is COLLIER.

Mr. Evjen says it is probable that Jochem Kalder was from Norway as that name is quite familiar among the Norwegians. According to the town records Jochem was quite intimate with Dirck Holgersen (Dirck, the Swede) and Pieter Jansen who were both Norwegians. Richard Gosman de Bevoise of Woodhaven, N. Y. considered that Jochem was of French or Walloon extraction.

Seversmith has this to say speaking of William Miller Collier. Andrew J. Provost Jr., Mr. Innes Getty and John E. Evjen, who were all descended from Jochem and had all made a very careful study of Jochem Collier and other New Amsterdam residents." The reader should understand that what follows represents essentially their work, just as though it appeared under their respective signatures. The present writer is grateful for the opportunity to present, in connection with his own descent the following record."

The Genealogical work by Andrew J. Provost Jr. is the only book in the Library besides Seversmith, although the other three have written genealogies of the Collier Family. "It is freely admitted that at this writing the origin of this surname is as unknown as the nativity of the progenitor of this family." -- Seversmith, Jochem's wife was Madalena Waele, the spelling of this surname is said to support the idea that it is of Walloon origin.

Provost has this to say of the Walloon: "The walloons were displaced Protestants, chiefly French who sought, but did not for long enjoy religious tolerance in the Provinces of S. E. Belgium. By about 1685 all of Belgium had been conquered by Spain and wholly lost to the Protestant faith. Those, who like great numbers of the Walloons refused to revert to Catholicism, fled to the Netherlands, Germany and England. A ship load of Walloons came to New Amsterdam from Holland in 1622 .

and found settlement there as well as at Ft. Orange and other Dutch Trading Posts." "They were good stuff -- these Walloons -- very eager to get away from European intolerance for good and all."

Jochem's wife married 2nd 1 March 1659, Gysbert Thueninzen Van Barnevelt, a widower. She went with her husband to Long Island. She was a Lutheran but in 1678 she joined the Dutch Ref. Church. On 12 February 1659 just before her second marriage she made arrangements for guardians for her children.

Michiel Collier, called Michiel the Freeholder, was the son of Jochem Collier and Magdalene Waele. His father came to New Amsterdam prior to 1644. A "freeholder" is one holding land in his own right either through inheritance or for services rendered.

Michiel calls himself of Kinderhook. He was eight years of age when his mother married the 2nd time and it is probable that he went with her to Long Island. When about 18 years of age, he went to Albany, N. Y. to join his older brother Jurrain who had settled at Kinderhook. On the 14 March 1686-7 the two brothers were recorded as "among those who have seated and settled themselves on lands in the original patent, with the consent of the early patentees, and have already made considerable improvement thereon."

The map accompanying the patent shows four parcels of land amounting to several hundred acres belonging to Michiel.

About 1703, he removed to Coxsackie, then a part of Albany Co., now in Greene Co. and directly across the Hudson River from Kinderhook, which is now in Columbus Co. He lived there the remainder of his long life and where in 1720 he was listed as "Freeholder" of Coxsackie. He is recorded as receiving 34 Acres of land from Jan Casperse Hollenbeck and had land dealings with Jan Van Hoesen and wife Rachel. His son, Jurrain, was also a "freeholder." Michiel Collier married first Engeltje Holderson, or Holgerson daughter of Dirk, the Swede, and his wife Sarah Verhael. Engeltje died soon after the birth of her first child, Magdalena, who married Casper Janse Hollenbeck. Michiel md. 2nd Fytje (Spphia) Franse Heusen dau. Jurrain Janse Van Heusen and wife Katherine, Michiel d. abt. 1733.

Early Record of Albany, N. Y. Vol. 3 NYA 2d gives M⁺ichael Collier's will made 6 November 1689. This would be about 44 years before his death. He appoints as guardian of his child or children Gurrain Van Heusen and French Herdick. He mentions his first wife, deceased "and now for the second time married to Fytje daughter of Jeurain Van Hoessen or Haessen. Signed by his mark M K New Albany. CHILDREN of Michiel Collier and his wife Fytje Franse Van Heusen, all Christened in Albany.

Miss Van Husen says: "The baptisms in the N. Y. Lutheran Church do not mean that all of the Children were baptized in the N. Y. Church. The explanation given is that the pastor traveled up and down the Hudson as far as Albany and baptized the children in homes and Churches wherever there were Lutherans."

JOHN (JOHANNES, JAN) COLLIER was the third child of Michiel Collier and Fytje Franse Heusen. He was chr. 9 April 1699. He married 3 December 1727 Magdalena Quackenbush, chr. 3 December 1705 at Schednectady, Schenectady, N. Y. She was the daughter of Pieter Johannse Quackenbush and Neoltje Marinus.

William Miller Collier says: Conclusive proof that this Johannes (3) of Montgomery Co.. Was the son of Michiel (2) of Loonenburg, Coxsackie in Green Co. is furnished by the quitclaim deed to land in Loonenburg by Jan Collier to his brother Jochem dated February 6, 1738, in which Jan is described as "of the Mohawk Country" and Jochem as of "The Fountain Flatts" in Coxsackie."

John (Johannes, Jan) Collier's home was in Montgomery Co., where he resided until his death.

QUACKENBUSH

The name QUACKENBUSH has had various spellings, such as; Quackenbosch, Quackenbos, Quakkenbosch, sometimes, Kwakkenbosh, until it eventually settled into QUACKENBUSH. The name is supposed to have been derived from Quail or quack and bos, or bush a forest. Sometimes the meaning is given in such a way as to suggest a quaken-aspen forest and "van" meaning "from" would literally mean Peter from the Quaking or quail forest.

Among the Dutch "se" added to a child's name means "child of." An eg. Pieterse means son of Pieter. Neeltje Pieterse Quackenbush would be daughter of Pieter Quackenbush.

There is a great deal of conflict and confusion in the early Dutch Records of New York--very few dates and what dates there are do not always agree.

We have hired Miss Allie Van Heusen, a Dutch genealogist from Amsterdam, N. Y. to help us get the records correct. She has the same Van Heusen line we have. She says several years ago, she went to the original Dutch records and copied the first Quackenbush families. She says the reason for so much trouble is because the records have been copied and compiled by New Englanders, who did not understand the Dutch way of keeping records, and have neglected many things that are so important in understanding them. They have neglected to add the letters "se" to a name where it should be and have omitted the initials j. m. after a man's name, meaning a young man and j. d. after the girl's name in the marriage records meaning that neither had been married before.

Pieter Quackenbush, the immigrant as near as is known was from Oestgeest in the vicinity of Leyden, Holland, and studied at Leyden, and it is thought that he was the son of Pieter Van Quackenbush. He was a brick and tile maker.

All records agree that he and his wife Maritie and infant son, Reynier, came to Albany when he was 21 years of age, but an error has been made in the year he came, most records giving it as 1660. In 1686-7a contract was made and Pieter Quackenbush sold and exchanged his house and brick yard in the colony of Rensselaerwyck, with Jacob Van Vorst for his house situated in Albany. Quackenbush agrees to deliver everything "that is fastened thereto by earth and nail, nothing in the world excepted but the burnt brick which at present are in the kiln shall belong to Quackenbush." Apparently this pantile and brick yard is the same as that belonging to Johade Hultet, which was occupied by Peter Bont as early as 1657 and which was sold to him 21 July 1668 by Adrian Van Ilpendam. Pantile was connected with tile making. This contract is signed Peter Bont,

otherwise called Quackenbush. The signing of this contract furnishes positive proof that Peter Bont and Peter Quackenbush were the same person. It also proves that the statement that Peter Quackenbush came in 1660 is not correct as Peter Bont was at Beverwyck as early as 1654, where we find his name as Bont in the Court Minutes of Ft. Orange and Beverwyck and find the name of Maritie the wife of Peter Bont or Peter Quackenbush. The name seems to be used interchangeably. N. Y. A2c Vol. 1.

It is not unlikely that Peter came over with Johan de Hutler, a partner in the colony of Rensselaerwyck, who sailed in 1653 with his family in the ship "Graft", taking with him "a goodly number of free persons among them some artisans especially a very good brick maker and many others mentioned in detail in the list to settle either in the said colony or elsewhere and assist in the cultivation of the soil there." Although Early Records of Albany Vol. 1 is not in the Library Miss Van Heusen quotes the above and it is also given in the "Documents Relating to Colonial History of New York, N. Y. 114 Vol. 14 pg 202.

What little information Simms gives in his History of Schorarie Co. is entirely wrong. In the Dutch Settlers of Albany Yearbook Mrs. George Myers Miller who claims her right to belong to the Society, thru Peter Quackenbush gives the date of his arrival in New York as 1654. Quoting from Miss Van Heusen's letter: "A great deal of later information garnered from old papers etc., that the Dutch Settlers Society of Albany has been going through, has come to light of late years."

The Peter Quackenbush who married Neeltje Marinus has generally been given as the son of Peter, the immigrant, but Miss Van Huesen gives him as Peter Johannese Quackenbush, which means that he was the son ^{of} Johannes Peterse Quackenbush who was the son of Peter the immigrant.

Austin A. Yates in his history of Schenectady Co. (N.Y. S4) gives him as Peter Johannese Quackenbush and gives his marriage to Neeltje Marinus as 1 November 1701. Yates says this Peter moved into Montgomery Co. and is the ancestor of numerous Quackenbush families west of Schenectady.

"The History and Early Settlers of Schenectady" by Sanders N. Y. S5 pg. 137, gives this Pieter as the son of Johannes Pieterse Quackenbush who was son of the immigrant. Sanders and Yates are the only compilers who give his father as Johannes Pieterse.

The History of the early New York Dutch Settlers gives the marriage of Johannes Pieterse Quackenbush first to Magtel Post and second to Anna Clute. Miss Van Huesen

shows that this second marriage is not correct, for the Johannes who married Anna Clute at the time of his marriage is marked j.m. and Johannes Pieterse Quackenbush and Magtel Post were the sponsors at the christening of his first child. It is errors like the above which have made it so hard to arrange the family groups correctly. Most compilers give the marriage date of Johannes and Magtel Post at 1683 which I am inclined to think is an approximated date. According to Miss Van Heusen the sixth child was christened 1684--no dates before that. But with the coming of Peter(Bont) Quackenbush seven years earlier than we thought there is a chance to approximate more correctly the births of the first five children.

Peter Quackenbush brought a younger sister with him, Maritje who married about 1662, Marten Cornelissen Van Buren, they were ancestors of President Van Buren.

Nicholas (Grosbeck) Smith, who was active in our church, was a descendant of Pieter Quackenbush the immigrant, whose grandson Wouter (Walter) married a Grosbeck. Nicholas G. Smith's mother was a Grosbeck.

JOHANNES PIETERSE QUACKENBUSH was the second son of Pieter Quackenbush, the immigrant and his wife Maritie whose maiden name is not know. Johannes married abt. 1673, Magtel Janse Post. The records as copied by the compilers gives his marriage second to Anna Clute but Miss Van Huesen shows that the Johannes who married Anna Clute was recorded as j.m. and Anna Clute marked j.d. meaning that neither had been married before. Johannes and Magtel Post Quackenbush were the sponsors when Johannes and Anna Clute's first child was born, 1702.

PETER JOHANNES QUACKENBUSH was the first son and third child of Johannes Pieterse Quackenbush and his wife Magtel Janse Post. He was born probably at Albany or near there about 1678, and married 19 Nov. 1701, Neeltje Marinus daughter of David Marinus and Rache. Hanse. According to Sanders he is the Peter who moved into Montgomery Co., and became the ancestor of all the Quackenbush families west of Schenectady. He was buried 20 July 1748.

The children of his daughter Magdalena and John Collier are registered in the Church at Ft. Hunter, Montgomery Co., N. Y.

The story is told that his oldest son, David, while working for Captain Scott, was asked by one of the other employed men to say a good word for him to Captain Scott's daughter, Ann, which David did rather reluctantly as he admired Miss Ann himself. Then the story is very much like the story of John Alden, for some encouragement from Miss Ann, David proposed and was married to her 11 May 1723.

My dear Mr. Merrick:

. . . I am a registered Genealogist, and do a great amount of work for western people . . .

A great deal of . . . information has come to light . . .

From this letter information it is clear that Jan Franse Van Hoesen and his wife did not come from Huizen on the Zuyder Zee. The name seems to have been originally Van Hussum, and Hussum is a place on the west coast of Schleswick, which belonged to Denmark until . . . Bismark. Also his wife, Volcke Jurrainse and her sister in signing deeds signed as Van Northstrand, and Northstrand is an island just across from Hussum. A good deal of this is given in the year Books of the Dutch Settlers society. . . I shall be glad to copy it for you at \$1.00 per hour. These letter records also give us the date of Franse's death, hitherto unknown, as 1665, when he died suddenly in the course of making his will.

Quite a lot of the early settlers of Albany . . . were not Dutch by birth, but were refugees to Holland from other countries. . . I found a note that said that many of the early settlers were Lutheran, among them being the Van Hoesens. Sure enough I found them in the Lutheran Church of New York. Also the tradition that Jurrain was the eldest son was not true nor that he was born on the high seas for Jan Franse had a son, Francis, 1640, Chr. Dutch Reformed Church of New Amsterdam, so they were in this country before that. Frans should have been the oldest son as the custom was to name the first son after the father's father and second son after the mother's family, in this case properly, Jurrain. Francis must have died very young for Jurrain was the oldest at his father's death.

On the chart you have left out one generation of the Quackenbush family, it should be;

1. Peter Quackenbush d. 1696 of Albany married Maritie.
2. Johannes Peter Quackenbush of Nishkayuna married Magtel Janse Post.
3. Peter Johannes Quackenbush, died 1748 married Neeltje Meunius.

The first Peter Quackenbush was son of Johannes, not Peter and the second was Peterse, son of Peter, the 3rd Peter Johannesse, son of Johannes. This is the regular method of naming the sons.

Pearson's First settlers of Albany has many mistakes in it because it was compiled by a New Englander, and not by a Dutchman. He overlooked such little things as j.m. (Young Man) and j.d. (Young Daughter) in marriage records, and did not put down the sponsors at the baptisms of the children, which is the only way one can prove a Dutch family correctly . . .

JAN FRANSEN VAN HEUSEN OR HUSUM

Several years ago I copied some information from the Hartford Times which stated that Jan Fransen Van Huesen and his wife, Volkie Jurrainse came from the Zuyder Zee in Holland and that their son Jurrainse was born on the high seas.

Miss Van Husen of Amsterdam, N. Y., who follows this same line and has spent a great deal of time on it, has corrected this statement saying that a great deal of information "has been garnered from old papers and records that the Dutch Settlers Society has been going through." The name seems to have been Van Husum, according to this new information.

Husum was located on the west coast of the Province of Schleswick, Denmark. The King of Denmark was Duke of Schleswick and Holstein Provinces in the southern part of the Danish peninsula but in 1864 they were given to Prussia by Bismark after the Danish War in spite of the "gallant resistance of the Danes."

Jan Fransen Heusen or Husum was in Albany before 1640 and according to these earlier records he is given as Van Husum. His wife, Volkie Jurrainse and her sister Jannetje Jurrainse in signing deeds signed their names as Van Nortstrandt, which is the name of an Island off the west coast of Schleswick and opposite Husum. According to this information they were Danish, although they may have been in Holland before coming to New York. The Van Heusens were Lutherans.

Their son, Jurrain was not the oldest son as they had a son Francis Christered in the Dutch Reformed Church in New Amsterdam in 1640. He must have died young as he is not named in his father's will, but Jurrain is named as the oldest son.

This follows closely the custom of naming their children, the first son being named for the father's father and the next son named for the Mother's father.

Volkie Jurrainse was a busy-body and mischief maker--was always in trouble with her neighbors. She was taken into Court and according to the Court Minutes was fined and reprimanded several times. Finally the Court bound her husband over to see that she kept the peace or pay a fine. "Whatever he did to her, she was never on the Court records again, although under Dutch Law a husband had no control over his wife. She kept her own property, and used it as she would, never even giving up her maiden name, very unlike the New England woman who had no rights after marriage."

In the "Hugson" the novelist Carl Carmer (the fifth chap.) gives an interesting account of the trouble between Volkie and her neighbors and he follows the Court Minutes very carefully.

Jan Fransen Van Heusen and his wife, Volkie Jurrainse made a joint-will which is very interesting. Her name is given as the daughter of Van Noortstrant, he Van Heusen, lying abed sick and his wife, Volkie Jurrainse, being of sound of body and both having full use of their faculties etc. First and foremost they commend their mortal souls to the gracious and merciful hands of God, their Creator and Redeemer and their bodies to Christain burial. The sole survivor of both of them shall be sole heir to all the property that may be left. The survivor shall be held to bring up the six minor and unmarried children, the survivor being appointed guardian of the said children, whereby to exclude and shut out the honorable orphan-masters and everyone else from the guardianship of the Children.

When the writing had progressed to the point where it was to be signed Jan Fransz Van Heusen wanted to get up from his bed and sit near the fire, where on being taken there and put in a chair, he suddenly unexpectedly gave up the ghost and died, Monday 20 November 1665 at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

The American Genealogist Vol. 30 N b2 gives Jan Fransz Van Heusen as age 31 in 1639, this would make him about 57 years of age when he died.

The Children named in the will are:

There were named two married daughters, Styntie Janse and Annatje Janse as having received their portion.

Jan Franse Van Heusen settled first at Ft. Orange and Beverwyck (now Albany) and purchased land, the principal purchase was that of Claverack, a deal made 5 June 1662 of several hundred acres including the site on which the city of Hudson now stands. It was bought for the sum of 500 guilders (value now about 40 cents) in beavers. It was owned by two Indians Parneteplet and Tatan Kenant. The sale was confirmed 11 of June all the signatures being made by signs or marks. Jurrain as the oldest son received letters of administration but an amiable settlement was made by which he conveyed the land adjoining the Hudson River to his brother, Johannes and his brother, Jacob and his brother-in-law Francis Harding. The deed was executed 7 Jan. 1704 and recorded in Albany. Volkie Jurrainse Van Heusen married second before 1678 Gerrit Visbeeck and again appeared in court as she and her husband were having trouble with the neighbors over a road. Volkie and her husband made an agreement with Jurrain 22 June. 1694 regarding the settlement of his father's estate.

Early Records of Albany Vol. 2 pg 400 gives an agreement between Volkie, (widow of Jan Van Huesen) and Gerritt Visbeeck and her son Jurrain Van Heusen Recorded 16 Nov. 1703. Translated from the original Dutch by Jonathan Pearson.

Also the 4 August 1684 Gerritt Visbeeck, husband and guardian of the widow of JanFranzen Van Heusen deeds land to Janse Jurrainse also to Jacob Van Heusen, to Frank Hardick and to Maria and Volkert.

Jurrain Janse Van Heusen was the oldest living son, age 23 years at the time of his father's death in 1665. As the will was not signed he made a contract with his brothers and sisters and settled his father's estate with his mother and his step-father as has been given above. He was probably a Freeholder a Freeholder as his brother Jacob was. A freeholder being owner of land in his own right received through inheritance or deed. Jurrain married Catherine (perhaps) Casperse. Jurrain's will was dated 15 May 1711 and names the following children with no ages given.

Fytje was Michael Collier's second wife and must have been several years younger than he was.

HANS CARELSE TOLL

Hans Careles Toll was in New Armsterdam, N. Y. between 1659 and 1660, in most cases his name being given as Hans Carelsen. In 1662 he is mentioned as Hans Carelsen Noorman, meaning that he came from Norway, another record says that Carel Hansen Toll came from Sweden, "directly from the Isle of Guracoa to Schenectady," but Carol Hansen Toll was the son of Hans Carelesen Toll and could not have come from Sweden or Norway either as his mother came from Holland in 1643 when she was 8 years old.

It seems that some of the historians have confused the two men. One statement says Carel Hansen Toll was Selectman during years when he was too young for that and it could have meant only his father. Conflicting statements of this kind make it difficult to make a perfect record.

In Early Records of Albany Vol.3 pg 152 we find this: Hans Carelsen Van Langessout, that is, Langesund, a town of Norway on the Skagerack, which is an arm of the North Sea, between Denmark and Norway. I think it is a fact that they were not Dutch but Scandinavian.

"On the 1 Apr. 1671 were married in New York, Hans Carelsen, widower of Neeltje Cornelise, residing in Albany and Geertje Teunis Widow of Cors Janszen residing here in New York" Hans Carelsen died before 20 May 1685 for on that date his widow married Francis Anthony. On the 3 Feb. 1661 Hans Carelsen, the Noorman, paid the Church for a large pall. I thought at first that this might have been for his wife but she is mentioned in her parents will in 1663. A large pall was for an adult and a small pall for a child. N.Y. A 1c Vol.7 pg/9.

Hans Carelsen Toll married Neeltje Cornelius born in Holland. 1635 a dau. of Corelis Sagerse Van Voorhout and Brechtgen Jacobse (which see.). Sheddied before 1671.

Rachel is never given the name of Toll.

Hans Carelsen Toll has many descendants through his son who have retained the name of Toll.

I have been unable to find anything more about David Williamse Marinus, except that he married Rachel Hanse and died before 1697 when she married 2nd Jeremiah Tickstone. Carel Hansen Toll's name appears many times in land transactions and mentions in several places of selling or buying land from Jeremiah Tickstone, who married his sister, Rachel.

CORNELIS SEGERSE (Van Egmont, Van Voorhout)

CORNELIS SEGERSE, Van Egmont on the 25 August 1643 signed a contract with Killiaen Van Rensselaer director of the Chartered West India Company at Amsterdam, Holland, and sailed in September ¹⁶⁴³ 1643 with his wife and children. On his arrival in Renesslaerwyck, he took up a farm on Castle Island near Albany. In 1644 his rent was by far the highest rent of any of the farmers in Renesslaerwyck. He owned 140 acres and maintained a Brewery on his property as well.

He uses the name of Van Egmont sometimes but his will is signed Corelis Zeegerzoon Van Vorhout. Egmont is near Alkmaar and Vorhout is a small place near Leyden. The prefix "Van" meaning simply from.

In one of the New York Histories there is a lengthy article giving the history of the name of Egmont which goes back fro generations in Holland but to me it did not prove that Cornelis was an Egmont. The name Van Egmont may have been from the place where he lived. At any rate, the family is recorded in the Genealogical Society Archives by the name of Egmont. Some of his descendants have used the name of Segerse, some Egmont and some Van Vorhout.

In the contract made by Cornelis Segerse and Van Renesselaer he binds them all to service, perhaps to pay for their passage. The names and ages in the contract in 1643 were:

Seger No. 4 was killed in a fight with Andries Herbertse Constapel whom he had severely wounded in the head with a piece of wook. He was reckless and of dissipated habits. Constapel was the husband of Annetje Jurrainse, a sister to Volkje wife of Jan Frans Van Heusen and both women appeared in court to ask for mercy for Constapel. Segerse Cornelis and his wife Brechie Jacobsen made a joint will dated 22 Nov. 1663, they mention their youngest daughter, Neeltje wife of Hans Carelsox, and Segerse's name is signed Zeegerzoon Van Vorhout.

In giving an outline of these Dutch lines I want it understood that there are many discrepancies and the lack of surnames, among the earlier settlers from Holland and Scandinavia, and the woeful lack of dates, and the conflict between the different historians and genealogists of the early New York records make it almost impossible to prepare what I think is any where near a perfect record. In the main the Pedigree is correct and I leave it with the hope that at some future time, not too far distant, I hope, if someone in the family becomes interested they will find what I have written as helpful and a foundation to build on and I also hope that it will be possible to complete the records. I wish to express my appreciation to all those who have in any way helped me with this record.

I am especially grateful for the help given me by Montchesney R. Gottsfredson a third great grandson of Matilda Robison King who came and offered his help July 1958 when I needed it to finish this manuscript.

I finish this short record with a feeling of respect for my Robison Ancestors and gratitude to them for the wonderful part they have taken in making it possible for their descendants to live in this wonderful land of liberty and especially to enjoy the blessings offered by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints which most of us enjoy.
